

## SAMPLE OF DAILY ACTIVITIES

### Day 1 & 2—Overnight flights to SA

Day 3—Guided Tours of Alexandra and events @ Puthadichaba. Visit to Bovet and Bhakilanga. Community, Service, Orphanage, and Alex. Old Age Home.

Day 4 - Round Square visit with Oprah's Leadership Academy. Followed by trip to Soweto and visit with Letsibogo Girls High School/tour of Soweto including lunch at Wandie's Place and Nelson Mandela's old house.

Day 5—Attractions/Sightseeing including Apartheid Museum/Caves/Maropeng, then transfer via tour bus to Kruger National Park—Edeni Lodge or similar.

Day 6—Kruger National—Early morning and afternoon game drives. Kruger—Sightseeing/Game Drive or travel to Mpumalanga for tour and overnight stay.

Day 7 - Kruger National Park sightseeing. Travel to Mpumalanga and stay overnight.

Day 8—Travel back to Jo' burg and board flight to Cape Town. Check-in at hotel and relax. Dinner outing

Day 9 —Board a catamaran and travel to Robben Island Museum for a 3-1/2 hr. guided tour. Followed by a trip by cable car to the summit of Table Mountain.

Day 10—Visit Khayalitshe/District 6 & Tour of Cape Town including Vineyards. Round Square visit to St. Cyprian's School (Western Cape).

Day 11—A full day tour of the Cape Peninsula including Cape Point, Groot Constantia and Kirstenbosch National Gardens & Shopping.

## ATTRACTIONS CONTINUED:

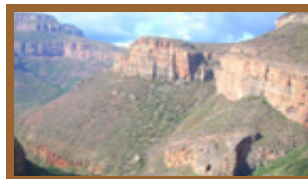
Johannesburg—Known as the business capital of South Africa. The city is characterized by a cosmopolitan, multicultural mix of people from all walks of life. There are many excellent museums, theatres, cultural precincts and craft markets to enjoy.



Pretoria—also known as the country's administrative capital where you can get a taste of the cultural history of South Africa. On this city tour, you will view the Union Buildings, the Voortrekker Monument with a ride on an ox wagon.



Sterkfontein Caves/Maropeng—Among the most remarkable and important discoveries made here, Mrs Ples, the famous 2.5 million year- old skull; the first complete Australopithecus ever to be found. More recently "Little Foot", a 3.3 million-year-old almost complete ape man skeleton was also found in the same caves. More than 500 hominid (early man) fossils found. Maropeng means "returning to the place of origin" in Setswana.

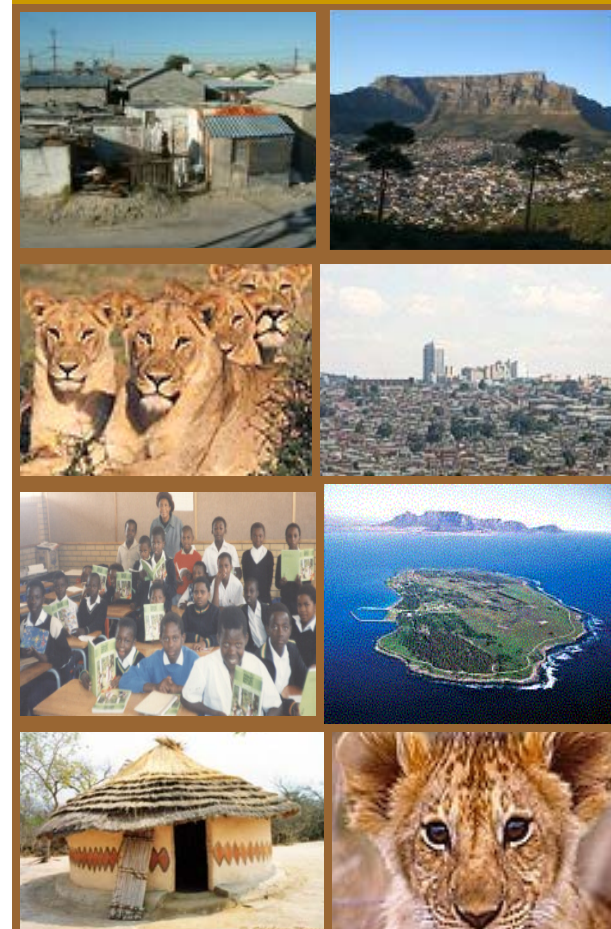

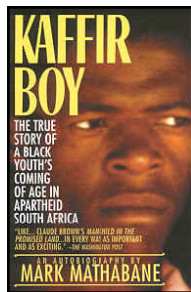

## ATTRACTIONS

**Alexandra**—One of South Africa's oldest townships. Established in 1912, Alexandra is one of the earliest urban black settlements in Jo'burg, predating even Soweto. It was in Alexandra that many early migrants lost their pastoral innocence and surrendered to the temptation of the urban milieu, albeit a squalid one.



**Robben Island**, site of the famous prison in which Nelson Mandela and other Apartheid Freedom Fighters were incarcerated for any years. Accompanied by a local site guide, we will tour the island and the former prison facilities and learn much about life on the island, its now famous former inmates and staff, and about this dark period of South African history.



**Soweto**—relive the events that sparked the change in South Africa, including the June 16, 1976 student uprisings by scholars of the Phefeni junior secondary school. Soweto is the most metropolitan township in the country, setting trends in politics, music, dance & language.



**Apartheid Museum (Gold Reef City)**—Defined as the story of the triumph of the human spirit over adversity. The museum illustrates the rise and fall of apartheid. The racially prejudiced

system that lighted progress and was finally triumphed by reason, crowning half a century of struggle.

**Khayalitsha & District 6**—South Africa's fastest growing township, and is one of Cape Town's leading tourist destinations. The impression from the outside is pretty grim—many shacks line the outskirts and give no indication of the vibrant culture within. But the government has implemented many housing projects and every day more and more families are moving into permanent houses.



**Table Mountain**—Known as Cape Town's majestic wonder, Table Mountain reaches a height of 1085m. You will travel on a Gondola to the top of the mountain where you will enjoy a bird's eye view during lunch in Table Mountain's restaurant.



**Kruger National Park (Edeni)**—an untamed garden of Eden where the spoor of wildlife invite you to explore the timeless beauty of the bush; where an oasis of unimaginable luxury provides the greatest vantage point to the Big Five and its vast, untouched wilderness. Edeni teems with an abundance of game, birdlife and diverse dense vegetation which provides the perfect habitat for the most secretive of Africa's large cats, the leopard.
